

Partition Installation Guide

What will be supplied:

- Acoustic Partitions
- Pivot Joiners (hinges)
- Polyester Feet (x2) - (made from same material as acoustic partitions)
- ABS Low Profile Feet (x2)

You will require:

- Scissors or Stanley knife

Preparation



Unpacking of the partitions, ***BE CAREFUL*** when cutting the outer packaging not to score the partition with your blade, as you will leave a cut in the partition material.





Assembly process:

Move through steps systematically, slowly and carefully in order to not damage the material.

1. Take your first upright.
2. Then take your base, and thread the upright through the base



(only insert one at a time, to prevent the partition/panel being creased)

3. Place both hands on the base,
gently and firmly apply pressure downwards.



4. Keep applying downward pressure. The panels are friction fit, they will be held together with no other additional materials.



5. Continue to apply pressure until you reach the bottom.



6. Repeat the process with second upright.

There are two feet provided with each partition



Alternatively, you can use the already assembled – ABS Low Profile foot



Hinges – Pivot Joiners:

You will receive enough hinges (pivot joiners) to fit into the slots that have been pre-cut on your partition, ready to receive the pivot joiner. They are also friction fit, it will be a tight fit.

1. Insert the joiner into slots available.



2. Fold Pivot Joiner and insert into neighboring panel.



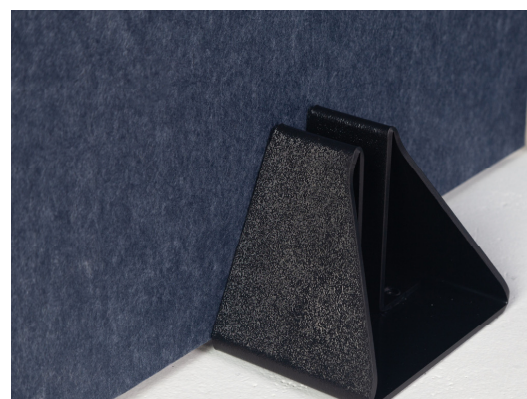
3. Do this for every joining panel until all joiners have been used.
4. Ensure they are pushed into the partition as far as they can be.



5. Open the partition so that it will stand on its own.



6. Then lift the partition into the chosen feet, and apply downward pressure to allow the partition to sit at the bottom of the foot;



There is no correct or incorrect way. Both feet (polyester & ABS low profile) have been designed, so that you can have the partition held in either direction, providing you with options.
